Introduction

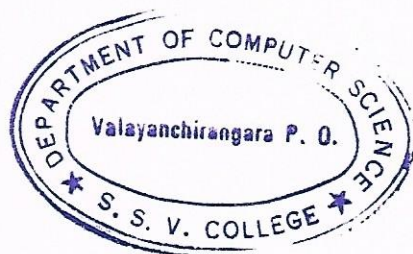

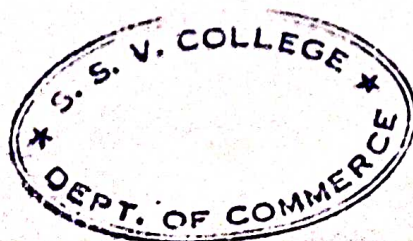
Overview:

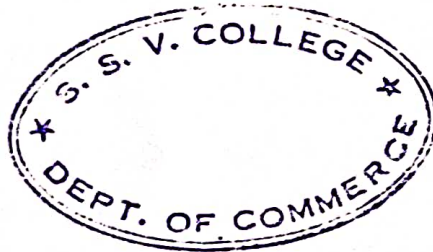

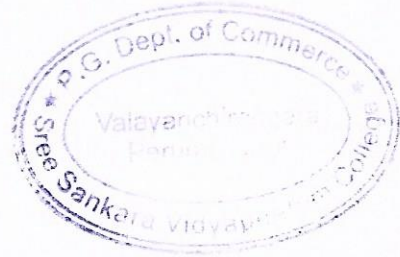

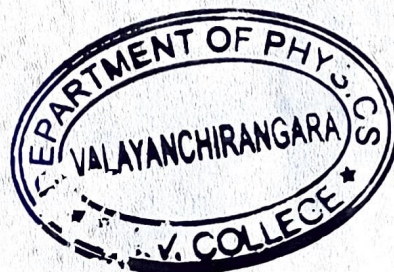
